*Gayle Nansel, Transmission Systems Planning Manager for the Upper Great Plains Region of Western Area Power Administration will address the Council on the potential for wind power development in Eastern MT. Issues to be addressed include transmission interconnections; three phase vs. single; line loss to distant markets; need to coordinate wind power with other, more reliable sources; and AC vs. DC transmission. Essentially, how do specific circumstances of the area affect how we encourage development of alternative energy. You will hear information to help answer...Do we have potential to access larger energy markets? Do we focus on development for local consumption? How may local utilities use it to the advantage of the local economy? What would be the effect of increased energy prices on local wind development?*

*Also invited is Mary K. Andersen, principal of Western Energy Planning and currently a consultant with TransCanada. Ms. Andersen will talk on the Keystone XL pipeline construction and TransCanada's Community Investment Program. Ms. Nansel will follow with comments on WAPA plans to supply electrical power to Keystone XL pump stations. Learn how the Keystone XL pipeline construction and operation will affect local natural resources and economics and how we may anticipate any enhancements and mitigations that may be made.*
